02 CLUB HISTORY 2016 - PRESENT

The club was proposed by Colleen and Steve Allan in 2015. After community consultation and consultation with Surf Life Saving NSW, Bay and Basin Community Nippers Club Inc. was formed with the Constitution and Deed of Agreement being approved on 1 July 2016.

The club is based on the Community Club model first introduced in 2014 with the formation of the Bawley Point Kioloa Community Nippers Club.

Bay and Basin Community Nippers is closely aligned with the mission and values of Surf Life Saving New South Wales (SLS NSW). We are a non-competitive club that focuses on surf education.

The inaugural session was on Sunday, 24th October 2016, at Sailors Beach, Huskisson.

In October 2019, the club moved from Huskission to Plantation Point Vincentia.

We are entering our 8th Season.

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WHAT YOUR CHILD/REN NEEDS TO BRING EVERY SUNDAY

To ensure safe and enjoyable Nippers sessions, please ensure your child brings the following items:

- BBCNC Rash shirt
- Nippers' age group cap
- Named drink bottle
- Swimmers/wetsuits and towel
- Sunscreen (applied before arrival)
- Beach shoes/thongs (optional)

Please note: NO CAP = NO SWIM. Borrowed spare caps are available and must be washed and returned the following week.

LINE UP, SIGN-IN, AND SIGN-OFF PROCEDURES

Children must line up in front of their Age Group flag on the large grass area, serving as the starting point for Nippers' activities. At the end of the session, all Age Groups must return here to be signed off. Caps can be removed once signed out. Parents and caregivers play a vital role in this process by ensuring their children are signed in and signed out on the group attendance list managed by the Age Manager. Signing off on the beach is not permitted. If you anticipate needing to leave early, kindly notify the age manager.

ACTIVE PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT AND VOLUNTEER ASSISTANCE

Active parental involvement is highly encouraged. Parents and caregivers must stay near the group at all times and are welcome to assist as needed, including potential water-related assistance. Please take your children to the toilet when necessary to minimize disruptions.

We welcome your volunteer services and talents to assist the club when possible. Parents, especially those with younger groups, may be required to enter the water or provide support in various ways. Please come prepared for such involvement.



PROMOTING SAFETY, RESPECT, AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Treat all participants with kindness and respect, following the golden rule of treating others as you would like to be treated. Encourage a positive and supportive atmosphere by applauding all good performances and efforts. Please assist in maintaining the equipment provided for the benefit of all. We expect all Nippers to help pack up, including washing down the boards.

Emphasize the importance of safety and respect for your child, reminding them to play by the rules, follow instructions, and listen to Age Managers and the Water Safety Crew. Please show your appreciation for our dedicated volunteers, Age Managers, Water Safety Personnel, First Aid Team, BBQ Crew, and Committee Members, who generously give their time for your child's benefit.

FUNDRAISING

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Bay and Basin Community Nippers Club operates as a non-profit organisation, relying on various funding sources to sustain its operations. These sources include grants, sponsorship, and, most significantly, fundraising initiatives. Fundraising plays a pivotal role in ensuring the continued success of our surf lifesaving club, allowing us to maintain and/or purchase essential equipment. Below, we have outlined some of the activities we encourage all our members to participate in actively:

- BBQs: These gatherings occur every Sunday. This is coordinated by the BBQ Coordinator and facilitated by parents/guardians. For further details, please refer to the Age Group Roster and the appendix.
- Additional Fundraising Events: We organise various fundraising events throughout the season. This includes a Bunnings BBQ, a raffle and Age Group Photos.
- Sponsorship Opportunities: If you know any businesses or individuals who may be interested in sponsoring our Nippers program, please don't hesitate to contact our committee.

Your active engagement in these fundraising activities helps us secure the necessary resources and fosters a strong sense of community within our club. We greatly appreciate your support, which allows us to continue our mission of saving lives and promoting beach safety.



AGE GROUP ROSTER

An Age Group will be rostered each week to help with set-up, pack-up, and BBQ. Your Age Manager will coordinate this, and you will need to provide your name and details to them before leaving the beach the week before your age group is rostered. Parental help is essential, and we appreciate and value your time.

Meeting Area Set-Up:

- Arrive at the meeting area at 9:30 am
- Set up Meeting area Layout tarps, put up flags, sign-in tables in front of flags, and place sign-in folders on each table with pens.
- Place sign-in folders for volunteers, spare caps, and admin box on the admin table. Place radios on the Admin desk, place the First Aid Kit under the Admin table and put the spinal board nearby.
- Place age group buckets near flags
- Lay rescue boards on the grass area with fins up (Large rescue boards and at least five foam boards per group).

Meeting Area Pack-Up - after all groups are back

- Wash off all rescue boards and stack them near the trailer
- Pack Trailer under the Gear Stewart's instructions
- Place Nipper's tubs in the trailer
- Collect all sign-in folders, pack up the admin table, and lace near the President's car.
- Pull down flags and place them in the trailer
- Fold up tables and tarps
- Put First Aid Equipment in the trailer

BBQ Duties:

- Three people from the age group are allocated to assist the BBQ coordinator from 9:30 am to approximately 12 pm
- Duties include setting up the BBQ Area, prepping and cooking the BBQ, serving, and packing up.
- Duties can be split up with different adults swapping in and out.

JUNIOR DEVELOPMENT AWARDS

As part of the Nippers program, children have the opportunity to gain a junior development award each season; each member should be encouraged to attain their respective age award.

- U14 Surf Rescue Certificate (SRC)

As Surf Education is delivered throughout the season, it is important to ensure your child is attending Nippers regularly to ensure they aren't missing out on key aspects of these awards.

END OF SEASON CLUB AWARDS

Each season, Bay and Basin Community Nippers Club Inc. recognises the outstanding achievement of our Nippers at our end-of-season presentation day. The awards aim not only to recognise achievement in surf sports but also to acknowledge participation in the Nipper program and reward those Nippers who exemplify our Club values.

Each child will receive a participation medal, and two children from each age group will be awarded either the Allround A or a Most Improved Award.



CAMERON BURKE 'CLUB SPIRIT' MEMORIAL SHIELD
